Insurance Commissioner Adam Hamm ("Commissioner") has determined as follows:

- 1. As a result of information obtained by the North Dakota Insurance
 Department ("Department") regarding the conduct of Brian Hagan, NPN 8600043
 ("Respondent"), the Commissioner has considered scheduling a formal hearing to
 determine whether Respondent's conduct as alleged constitutes a basis for imposition
 of a civil penalty or any other action the Commissioner deems necessary. As more fully
 described below, Respondent's conduct is alleged to be in violation of N.D.C.C. § 26.126-45.1(1).
 - 2. N.D.C.C. § 26.1-26-45.1 states, in part:

26.1-26-45.1. Reporting of actions.

 An insurance producer shall report to the commissioner any administrative action taken against the insurance producer's license in another jurisdiction or by another governmental agency in this state within thirty days of the final disposition of the matter. This report must include a copy of the order, consent to order, or other relevant legal documents.

- 3. Respondent has been licensed as a nonresident insurance producer in North Dakota since May 4, 2011.
- 4. On or about January 18, 2016, Respondent submitted an application to renew his nonresident insurance producer license in North Dakota. A background investigation revealed that on or about December 22, 2011, California issued a restricted license to Respondent. The California administrative action should have been reported to North Dakota by January 22, 2012, and it was not reported until February 29, 2012. Respondent's failure to report an administrative action within 30 days is in violation of N.D.C.C. § 26.1-26-45.1(1).
- 5. On or about April 2, 2012, Washington revoked Respondent's insurance producer license. The Washington administrative action should have been reported to North Dakota by May 2, 2012, and it was not reported until July 2, 2012. Respondent's failure to report an administrative action within 30 days is in violation of N.D.C.C. § 26.1-26-45.1(1).
- 6. On or about November 24, 2015 California removed license restrictions placed on Respondent's insurance producer license. The California administrative action should have been reported to North Dakota by December 24, 2015, and it was not. Respondent's failure to report an administrative action within 30 days is in violation of N.D.C.C. § 26.1-26-45.1(1).
 - 7. Respondent's actions constitute violations of N.D.C.C. § 26.1-26-45.1(1).
- 8. Respondent acknowledges that at the time of signing the Consent to Entry of Order, he was aware of or had been advised of the right to a hearing in this matter, to

consult an attorney, to present argument to the Commissioner, to appeal from any adverse determination after a hearing, and Respondent expressly waives those rights.

- 9. Respondent has agreed to informal disposition of this matter, without a hearing, as provided under N.D.C.C. § 28-32-22.
- 10. For purposes of resolving this matter without further administrative proceedings, Respondent has agreed to enter into the following order.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. Respondent agrees to pay a fine in the amount of \$300 payable by money order, cashier's check, or credit card to the North Dakota Insurance Department within 20 days of the effective date of this Order.
- 2. The use of this Consent Order for competitive purposes by an insurance agent or agency holding a license in the State of North Dakota, or by any company holding a Certificate of Authority, or by anyone on their behalf, may be deemed unfair competition and be grounds for suspension or revocation of said license or authority.
